If not, then ask for other payment options for the time being.

Receptionist: He is with another patient. Please fill up these forms and take a seat here.

You: Actually I am a foreigner and these procedures are new to me. Can you please guide me?

Receptionist: Sure.

You: What all details you need to know?

Receptionist: Since you are a foreigner, you need to have a photocopy of your passport and fill in the insurance details. You also need to add the details of a local contact person in case of emergencies.

You: Is there any consultation fees?

Receptionist: There is a flat fee of 150 pesos. But it will be taken care off by insurance along with any further treatments necessary.

You: What about the medicine costs?

Receptionist: That will have to be borne by you.

You: Okay. Thanks. Please let me know when my turn comes up.

Receptionist: Sure. Will do.
