

## I.e. v/s E.g.: Do you know the difference?

### What does 'e.g.' stand for?

'e.g.' stands for the Latin phrase 'exempli gratia' that means 'the sake of example'. This abbreviation is usually used when giving an example. The English translation of the two alphabets 'e.g.' means 'example given'.

**Usage-** I love animals. (e.g., cats and dogs)

Let's take a look at a few tips and tricks that could help you improve your English communication skills and give you a deeper understanding of the same.



### Tips and tricks to use 'i.e.' and 'e.g.':

1. Take time to understand the meaning of the abbreviation. Know what each of them stands for, as that will simplify the process further.
2. Learn the art of association. Make sure to associate the abbreviations with their individual meaning, as that is the ideal way of refraining from any sort of confusion.
3. Understand that 'i.e.' is an abbreviation that is used to paraphrase after making a statement.
4. Make an attempt at replacing the abbreviations with their meanings and see whether it makes any sense. This is a great way to double check, if you're using the right abbreviation at the right place.
5. Use 'e.g.' before giving examples.
6. While using 'e.g.', there is no need for you to use the term 'etc', as 'e.g.' refers to an incomplete list.
7. Avoid using the abbreviations 'e.g.' and 'i.e.' while speaking in English, as that would just sound stupid. Instead, used the words such as 'for instance' and 'in other words'.



It is important for you to understand the difference between each abbreviation and that will come only with practice. Be sure to write and practice, as that will give you a better understanding of the same.
