Let us have a look at these famous English Idioms:

1. Go the extra mile

To try very hard or make a special effort to achieve your goal.

Examples:

- If you want to achieve the target you must go the extra mile.
- Go the extra mile and you shall score good marks.

2. Once in a blue moon

When something rarely ever happens

Examples:

- The management conducts meeting once in a blue moon.
- He goes out to the party once in a blue moon.

3. Come out swinging

To be confrontational and strongly defend yourself at the beginning of a debate.

Examples:

- He came out swinging in today's meeting.
- HR selects candidates who come out swinging in the group discussion.

4. Shoot from the hip

To speak directly

Examples:

- Our new boss shoots from the hip.
- Men like women who shoot from the hip.

5. Blow smoke

To exaggerate or say things that aren't true, to make you seem better

Examples:

- Don't you think she is blowing smoke between them?
- The miscommunication that was created between couple was due to blowed smoke.



6. Comfort food

Food that makes you feel better, because it reminds you of your childhood

Examples:

- After a long time, I had a comfort food.
- I enjoy my weekends when my mom prepares some comfort food.

7. Hear on the grapevine

To hear a rumor or unconfirmed story.

Examples:

- I heard on the grapevine that the mother has killed her daughter.
- I heard on the grapevine that Meena and Karan are dating.

8. Sit on the fence

To stay neutral and not take sides.

Examples:

- It's better to sit on fence rather than talking to you guys.
- You both are my friends so I'll sit on the fence.

9. Hit the books

To study very hard.

Examples:

- As the exam nears students hit the books.
- To achieve 1st rank you must hit the books.

10. Miss the boat

When someone has missed his/her opportunity to do something.

Examples:

- If Sukanya had not quit her job she would have missed the boat.
- Don't miss the boat if you are getting a job abroad.
