This is one of the most difficult tongue twisters. It will help your s and sh sound.

3. Peter piper picked a peck of pickled peppers.

The above tongue twister will improve your p.

4. Fuzzy Wuzzy was a bear. Fuzzy Wuzzy had no hair. Fuzzy Wuzzy wasn't fuzzy, was he?

You can improve your f and w letter sound with this twister.

5. How much wood would a woodchuck chuck if a woodchuck could chuck wood?
He would chuck, he would, as much as he could, and chuck as much wood
As a woodchuck would if a woodchuck could chuck wood

Well, you can improve your 'w' and 'c' pronunciation.

6. The thirty-three thieves thought that they thrilled the throne throughout Thursday.

Improve your 'th' sound with the above tongue twister.

7. Susie works in a shoeshine shop. Where she shines she sits, and where she sits she shines.

The above tongue twister will improve your 'sh' pronunciation.
