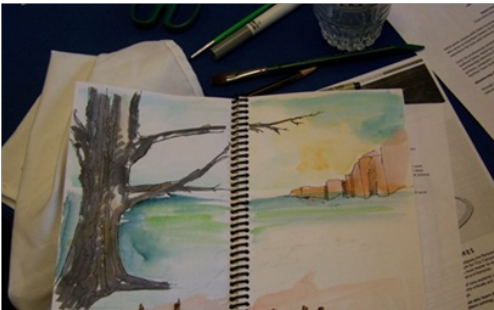
Things To Remember When Describing A Painting:

1. Have all information

It is important to have all the information about a painting. There is nothing more embarrassing than to stammer around for answers. When you have all the information regarding a painting, you will be in a good position to solve any doubts the viewers may have. It will involve a bit of a research which will improve your English comprehension skills. Even if you don't have all the information, redirect the visitors to the appropriate sources.

2. Engaging conversation

Never keep your description one sided. Ask interesting questions to them and get them engaged in the conversation. You can only do this when your English conversational skills are up to the mark. Use [grammatically correct sentences](#) while communicating.



Sample Conversation While Describing A Painting Picture:

Situation: You are taking the visitors through the museum when they come across a Vincent Van Gogh painting

You: Ladies and gentlemen, here is the famous Van Gogh painting.

Visitor 1: Wow! It's so beautiful! What is it called?

You: You can check our pamphlet at the end of the tour listing the literary sources backing up our description.

Visitor 1: This really is a great painting. What will be its price?

You: At the current market rate, it will fetch around \$25 million.

Visitor 2: Whoa! That is a fortune. The security here must be tight.

You: Yes, it is. The painting glass frame is virtually impregnable. Now, if you don't have any further questions, let's move on to the next painting.
