Before Phoebe be Phoebe Beebee"

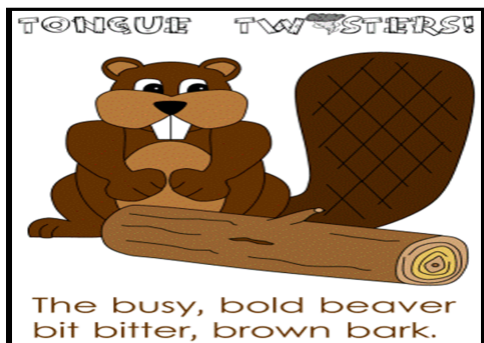
6. A tutor who tooted the flute
